Title: Social Worker at Brave to Love Non-Profit Organisation

About the position and Brave to Love:

Brave to Love is a counter-sex trafficking non-profit organisation. The primary mission of the social worker is to enhance human well-being and help meet the basic human needs of Brave to Love's clients (women in prostitution and sex trafficking), with particular attention to the needs and empowerment of vulnerable, oppressed, and impoverished people. Brave to Love's mission is to reach, rescue, rehabilitate, restore and re-integrate victims and survivors of trafficking and the system of prostitution.

Requirements for the position:

1. Registered Social Worker with SACSSP
2. At least 5-10 years of experience working in the field.
3. Must be based in Pretoria.
4. Valid driver's license and car.
5. A history of working with drug addiction will be an advantage.
6. Good managing skills to manage safehouses of survivors.
7. This position requires weekend and evening work in case of emergencies, outreaches and police rescue operations.
8. The person needs to be an excellent problem-solver.
9. Be driven with strong leadership skills.
10. Have excellent skills in conflict management and team building.
11. Strong administrative skills are required.
12. Have a positive strong character and an example for young women to follow.
13. Affirm Christian values and faith.
14. Proficiency in trauma-informed care.
15. Experience in leading a team of people.

16. Demonstrated ability to build strong relationships and provide compassionate care and empathy.
17. Able to work independently and collaborate well within diverse teams.
18. This is a long-term position to ensure victims' well-being.
19. Must be willing to support police on raids and rescue operations.
20. Be able to work fast, and sufficiently, and be eager to learn and grow.

Specific Responsibilities

1. Managing the Housemothers at the Safehouses and ensuring the overall holistic health of housemothers.
2. Managing the programs of victims in the Brave to Love homes.
3. Help with enrolling and managing of skills development programs for all beneficiaries.
4. Administrative duties within the restoration homes, the housemothers and beneficiaries' programs.
5. Coordinate volunteers involved with the recovery programs.
6. Maintain an emotionally supportive environment and ensure the well-being of beneficiaries by addressing physical and mental health needs.
7. Coordinate and oversee beneficiaries' recovery programme and transport needs.
8. Managing the financial budget of safehouses
9. Practice trauma-informed, culturally and linguistically sensitive, survivor-centered practices in interactions with clients, staff, service provider organisations, and other stakeholders.
10. Assist the Department of Social Development regarding victims of sex trafficking.
11. Assist police regarding cases of victims of sex trafficking.
12. Identify victims of human trafficking
13. Assist Law Enforcement with rescues and interventions.
14. Assist with court proceedings, victim empowerment statements and court preparation of victims.
15. Help with prevention talks and projects.
16. Govern the helpline for possible victims needing help.
17. Assist with counseling and group sessions.
18. Screen and assess candidates needing to enter the Brave Home.
19. Managing Safehouses registration with the Department of Social Development.
20. Help survivors with safe integration back into society.
21. Monthly report writing and assessment of survivors in the program.
22. Assist with addiction recovery programs.
